## Before a flood

- Register: individuals, organisations and businesses in Cookham should register with the Environment Agency's Floodline Warnings Direct on 0845 988 1188
- Prepare a flood kit: containing key personal documents, torch, battery or wind-up radio, mobile phone, rubber gloves, Wellington boots, waterproof clothing, first aid kit and blankets.
- Individuals should make a flood plan: list essential things you need to take in a flood evacuation; make sure you know how to turn off gas and electricity, even in the dark; install protective equipment such as doorguards and closeable airbricks (sandbags may not be available); work out how to protect valuable and sentimental belongings; where would you move your car to?
- Businesses and organisations should make a flood plan: safe evacuation of customers and visitors; protection of property and business from flood damage.



## During a flood

In a severe flood, the roads north of Cookham Village to Bourne End and west across the Moor will be flooded first. The police will close these roads, and traffic will be diverted south along the A4094 Sutton Road until it floods. When all roads into Cookham village have closed the Causeway will be open alternately to vehicles (under 3.5 tonnes) and pedestrians during specified times as publicised on the Cookham Flood Warnings Blogspot and Parish Notice Boards. Cookham Parish Council will open the Flood Hub in Moor Hall to receive and disseminate community information tel no 07593 528 060 or 07593 528 062. Its Community Flood Plan has prepared it to:

- take direction from and provide information to RBWM's Emergency Operation Centre
- collate information on vulnerable people and co-ordinate volunteer helpers
- co-ordinate a list of volunteers to marshal pedestrians across the Causeway (RBWM contractors will direct vehicles in single file)
- provide local information to emergency responders from fire, police, ambulance, territorial army and RBWM
- liaise with upstream parishes at Hurley and Bisham
- open survivor centres at Pinder Hall, Lower Road SL6 9EH and Elizabeth House, Station Hill SL6 9BS

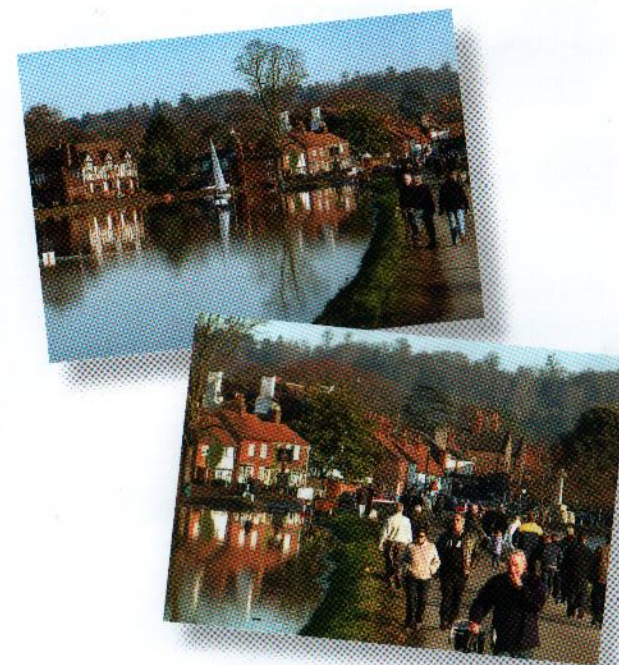
