CHAIRMAN'S FORWARD

I am delighted to introduce our first ever Annual Report. It summarises a busy year of delivering our core services such as allotments, burials at the Long Lane cemetery, managing the Alfred Major Recreation Ground, clearing footpaths and maintaining street lights as well as managing Odney Common, letting Cemetery Cottage and community projects on flooding, nature conservation and planning refurbishment of the Cookham Dean War Memorial. I think it will help Councillors and residents reflect on what their Council has achieved so that we can keep improving. Do let me know what you think of it so that the Council can develop future formats.

As a joint sponsor of the Village Design Statement, the Council is pleased to see it increasingly being applied to planning decisions, and intends to continue working with the Cookham Society, Borough Council and others to realize its guidance and recommendations.

During the year I have been meeting community groups with Cllr Janet Palmer to spread the word about the work of the Parish Council, and listen to new ideas. We are grateful to the Cookham Society, Media Hub, St John the Baptist's Parochial Church Council, Holy Trinity Parochial Church Council for welcoming us to their meetings and sharing some of their thoughts.

Another new initiative this year has been a monthly news page in the Parish Magazine. I am grateful to the Churches for giving us space in their publication and pleased by how popular it seems to be.

I would like to thank all the Parish Councillors for their service to Cookham during this year. We are grateful to our Clerk, Anne Osborne for all her hard work. We were all very sorry to see our Assistant Clerk Margaret Soper move on in September. Margaret resigned to move to North Wales and we wish her well. I extend a warm welcome to Jill Gavin who replaced Margaret in September and has already impressed us with her ability to take on the wide range of issues the Council deals with.

All the Council's fifteen seats are up for election on 7th May 2015. The Council has been advertising the elections to try and attract enough candidates for there to be elections in all three wards – Cookham Rise (9 seats), West ward (4 seats for Cookham Dean) and Cookham vilage (2 seats). The deadline for nominations is 9th April 2015. Almost all residents are eligible to stand for election to the Council, and I can recommend it as a rewarding way to serve your community.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Planning Committee

The Parish Council has commented on 152 planning applications, including tree works, this year. We are becoming more familiar with applying the VDS to our deliberations, as are the planning authority at the Borough Council.

The Council has considered whether to initiate a Neighbourhood Plan, but decided that although it would be an important document for Cookham at some stage, it could not undertake the work until the Local Plan for the whole Borough was known.

It also considered whether to take on responsibility for minor planning decisions itself but agreed, due to the forthcoming elections, that a decision should be made during the new Council year.

Councillors and other local decisionmakers enjoyed an excellent presentation from Brian Clews on Cookham's wildlife which has helped us become more aware of how to take account of biodiversity in our decisions about planning applications and other issues.



Adoptive Acts Committee

Responsibility for Cookham Parish Cemetery, both War Memorials, the Tarrystone Seat and Street Lighting lies with the Adoptive Acts Committee.



The Cemetery and Chapel offer a well regarded facility with 20 Burials and Ashes Interments taking place over the past 12 months.

The south side of the Chapel has benefitted from some renovation and redecoration of the woodwork with plans for work on the other sides due later in 2015.

There are 85 street lights owned by the Parish Council with maintenance and repairs subcontracted to SSE. The Committee also liaises with RBWM to control and improve the lighting not under the control of the Council.

In May work is due to commence on Cookham Dean War Memorial, representing one of the most important and exciting projects undertaken by the Council in recent years. The refurbishment will restore and preserve this iconic piece of Cookham's history for future generations.

It is planned that Cookham Village War Memorial will be cleaned in time for Cookham Festival.

Flood Committee

The Flood Committee has welcomed the Parish Flood Coordinator Carol Long, Flood Warden Paul Wilmott, representatives of the Odney Club, Chartered Institute of Marketing and Cookham Society to attend its meetings. Following the floods last year, which saw Cookham village cut off by road for 14 days, the group has published a lessons learned leaflet and arranged meetings with Thames Water to address the failure of Lightlands Lane pumping station. The Committee has arranged for a Flood Hub to be opened in the Chartered Institute of Marketing when we next have flooding problems; it will provide information to residents and RBWM, and co-ordinate local responses.



Footpaths and Open Spaces Committee



The Footpaths Committee oversees a wide range of responsibilities including the maintenance and clearance of all footpaths (not pavements), the Alfred Major Recreation Ground, Stonehouse Common and the general upkeep of Odney Common.

In addition, it covers the administration of the three allotment sites with regard to letting, collection of rent and general maintenance.

Once again the Parish Council will be coordinating the three villages entries into the Thames and Chiltern In Bloom competition. The preparation and management of this will be carried out by members of the Footpaths Committee ably assisted by residents and RBWM.



Finance and General Purposes Committee

The Committee considers all matters concerning the finances of the Council including the annual internal and external audits, staff salaries, insurances, office equipment, and the management of Cemetery Cottage.

All employment issues are dealt with by the Committee prior to referral to the Full Council when necessary.

In consultation with the other standing committees, the Finance Committee prepares annual Budget and Precept figures for recommendation to the Council.

COMMUNITY PROJECTS

War memorial



The Council have been successful in securing a substantial grant from the War Memorials Trust to facilitate the restoration of Cookham Dean War Memorial. Generous donations from local sources, including RBWM, have also been gratefully received.

The work will commence in May after the Cookham Festival and is expected to take approx 2 months.

A specialist architect has been appointed to manage the project with the Council remaining in overall control.

Following professional expert advice, the aim of the work will be to conserve the shaft and cross and prevent the existing erosion from worsening.


General repairs, including re-pointing and cleaning will be carried out on all parts of the Memorial and surrounding area.

The correction and addition of commemorative names will also be researched.

The Council are keen to raise awareness of this on-going problem caused by a minority of dog owners.

Councillors have worked with the Community Warden who can issue Fixed Penalty Notices to offenders.

An Awareness Exercise was held on the Alfred Major Recreation last year which generated useful publicity and it will be repeated later this year.

Harris-Woodbridge Wildlife Reserve



Much development has taken place at the Wildlife Reserve over the past year.

The area has been cleared of excess growth to allow assessment of what plants and trees were growing naturally and encourage them to flourish.



Twelve new trees have been planted and bird, bat and owl boxes installed. An exciting recent addition has been the creation of a natural pond which will eventually be edged with decking.



Winding footpaths will allow disabled access through the Reserve and the Council hope it will eventually become a popular destination for schools and wildlife enthusiasts.

Thames and Chiltern in Bloom



After last year's hiatus, the Council have been busy working on our entries for the 2015 competition.



Councillors have liaised with local groups and schools to ensure that when judging takes place in early July, we can demonstrate the Community's involvement in enhancing the environment and sustainability of Cookham.



The Community Allotment on the Alfred Major site is a great example as it encompasses evidence of the three themes the judges will asses i.e. horticultural achievement, community participation and environmental responsibility.



Station Hill Road Safety

The Council has long been concerned about this issue and is pleased to report that measures are underway to improve pedestrian and vehicle safety at Station Hill.

The first phase, to be implemented shortly, will include the installation of parking restrictions and bollards on the verge opposite Country Stores.

The next phase, which will require consultation with Network Rail, is currently being discussed.

COUNCIL FINANCE

Precept

As part of local government, Town and Parish Councils have and use the power to tax residents in the local community to raise money to cover their running costs and community projects.

The amount of tax, known as the Precept, can vary widely depending on the size of the Council, the population of the community and the services it provides.

In November each year the Parish Council produces a Budget for the next financial year detailing estimated income and expenditure and therefore the amount of tax that will be required. This information is submitted to the principal authority, the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead, who then collect it on behalf of the Parish Council as part of residents' overall Council tax charge.

Role of the Responsible Financial Officer

All Parish Councils must have a Responsible Financial Officer, as defined in Law. The RFO is an employee of the Council and is responsible for the Council's finances, accounts and budgets but only in an operational capacity. The power to make all decisions relating to financial matters belongs to the Council.

In Cookham, as in many other Councils, the role of the RFO is combined with that of the Parish Clerk.

The figures opposite show the income and expenditure for the year 2014-2015 so far compared with the Budget and also actual figures from 2013-2014. The Budget agreed by the Council in November for 1 April 2015 to 31 March 2016 is also shown.
