

Dear Local Resident, January 2016

In an effort to improve communication between the "Lets Rock The Moor" team and local Cookham residents, we are writing to let you know about some of our plans to improve vehicular and pedestrian traffic at the end of the concert.


We also want to brief you on the basic timetable for the Production Schedule, covering the set-up and clearance of the site, so that residents know what to expect and when. At this early stage, some timings may need to be changed slightly, especially as we get nearer to the event, due to operational or supplier issues, but the start date will not change, nor will the date when we leave the site clear.

Exit (Egress) Planning for Vehicular and Pedestrian Traffic

To improve the flow and safety of both vehicles and pedestrians leaving the site after the concert, we have met with the Local Authority, the Police and our own Health and Safety consultants to propose the implementation of a one way exit system by way of a Temporary Traffic Road Order, known as a TTRO.

Plans for this are shown below, and we want to emphasise that this system will only be implemented from 21:30 to 23:30 (or earlier if traffic has cleared) on the day of the event.





Details of the one way TTRO

- One way TTRO implementation along the B4447 and through The Pound (between 1 and 3 on the map) but allowing traffic from Berries Road two way exit;
- Divide The Pound by use of Temporary Pedestrian Road Barriers to allow Pedestrian access through the Pound, physically separated from one way traffic (between 2 and 3 on the map);
- Security personnel will ensure Pedestrians follow lit and roped off walkways along The Pound and around the Northern edge of The Moor (shown by blue arrows on the map) to avoid vehicular and pedestrian mix.

Please Note: The one way TTRO (Temporary Traffic Road Order) will only be implemented between 21:30 and 23:30 (or earlier if pedestrians have cleared the area) on the day of the event, and will be managed by Forest Traffic Management (a DFT approved and qualified Traffic Management contractor)

Why the need for a one way TTRO?

The implementation of a new, one way TTRO at the exit of the event will dramatically reduce any congestion at the end of the event when the bulk of the attending public leave the field;

- It will ensure that all traffic will flow quickly in one direction out of the site and away from the Village;
- Cookham High Street will remain clear of any vehicles exiting the event;
- It will keep pedestrians walking back to their homes in Cookham, or the train station, separated from cars and other vehicles;
- Taxis will no longer be allowed to stop anywhere on the one way system causing an obstruction.

After meeting with the local authority, the Police and our Health & Safety consultants to discuss this, it was recommended that we apply for the TTRO. All parties involved believe that this system will radically improve the event experience for both concertgoers and the local community.

Traffic diversions, to keep through traffic away from the area, will be put in place with appropriate signage in advance of the concert.

Let's Rock The Moor 2016 - Main Infrastructure Production Schedule

Below is a summary of the timetable of the Production Schedule for the 2016 event (the build and break of the event) so local residents know what to expect and when.

As previously stated, some timings may need to be changed slightly, especially as we get nearer to the event due to operational or supplier issues, but the start date will not change, nor the date when we leave the site clear.
