# **★** COLOUR IN ART Michaela Cranmer

This course aims to provide students with an appreciation of the role of colour in the history of art. It will begin with a comparison of a range of pigment types, from the red ochre of cave paintings to the cobalt blue of Impressionist paintings, and a brief look at colour theory and terminology. This will be followed by a consideration of the way artists have used colour to communicate ideas and/or emotions, from the Renaissance to the present day. The course will end with a look at modern and contemporary art, with an emphasis on the use of modern synthetic pigments and paints. **N.B.** Last meeting 6 February. This will be an online Zoom course.

# **★** WORLD HERITAGE ARCHITECTURE IN MAINLAND EUROPE Keith Hasted

UNESCO's designation of World Heritage in Europe now includes some of the world's most extraordinary and varied architecture, our sampling of this will include: Norman Palermo and Monreale in Sicily, Santa Maria delle Grazie in Milan, Turin under the House of Savoy, the magnificent cathedral at Chartres, the historic city of Lyon, the Romanesque masterpiece of Speyer's cathedral, Lisbon's Jerónimos monastery, and Granada's Alhambra. **N.B.** Last meeting 19 March. The last session will run from 10:00 to 11:00 i.e. 1 hour only.

# **★** DAILY LIFE IN ANCIENT EGYPT John Billman

What was life like in ancient Egypt? What were the educational opportunities for children? What can we understand about different jobs? Why is magic part of childbirth? In a subject often focused on preparations for death, this course will explore aspects of life, from the risky process of childbirth, through childhood and games, education, work and housing. Based on evidence from across Pharaonic Egypt, we will draw upon texts, artefacts and tomb reliefs to provide a broad range of sources about both elite and, where possible, non-elite individuals. **N.B.** Last meeting 27 March.

### **OUDCE-WEA FEBRUARY STUDY DAY 2024**

# ♦ HISTORY AND MYTH IN PAINTING, SCULPTURE AND PHOTOGRAPHY Sandra Smith

The aim of this study day is to introduce the way historical events, myths and stories from the ancient world have inspired artists, both in the ancient period and since. We will explore art forms ranging from some of the great ancient buildings of Greece and Rome, through painting and sculpture, to photography, conceptual art and contemporary installations. Great artists from Phydias and Exekias, Bernini, Botticelli, Rembrandt, Delacroix, Picasso and Marc Quinn will be included.

1. Heroism, war, history and myth - the art of the ancient world

This lecture will investigate the way in which ancient people, especially those in the classical world, combined the idea of great historical events with their ritual beliefs, myths and legends, to create art forms that are both beautiful, innovative and somewhat informative. The stories of Troy – history based in mythology but also some half-remembered ancient reality, will form the core of this section, with a study of Greek vase painting, sculpture and ancient architecture.

- 2. Heroism, war, history and myth the art of the Renaissance and Baroque The great thinkers of the Italian Renaissance re-invigorated the use of classical mythology to tell their own stories. We will investigate some of the works of great Renaissance painters and sculptors, who used their studies of ancient art to inform their own works, both classical in subject, but also Christian themes and indeed contemporary events. Michelangelo, Botticelli, Raphael, Rubens and Bernini will be studied in this section.
- **3. Heroism, war, history and myth the 19**<sup>th</sup> **and early 20**<sup>th</sup> **centuries** Modernism and myth do not always seem like obvious bedfellows, but in this section we will investigate the ways in which 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century Romantics and Classicists used mythology to explore contemporary events, and indeed to describe modern life and particularly modern warfare. The works of David and Delacroix will begin this section, with the powerful works of the American Civil War and World Wars One and Two completing it. Photography will also be investigated in this theme.
- 4. Heroism, war, history and myth today.

In this final section we will investigate the way in which modern and contemporary artists have drawn upon the ideas of myth and history to create a whole new world of artworks which cover universal themes and ideas. Works inspired by classical characters such as Narcissus or the Minotaur by a wide range of artists will be included, along with photographs, sculptures and installations exploring a variety of western and non-western myths and stories.

# **▼** ERIC RAVILIOUS AND THE ARTISTIC COMMUNITY OF GREAT BARDFIELD

### Rosanna Eckersley

Artists in Great Bardfield exchanged ideas, organised village exhibitions and, importantly, valued all forms of art and craft. This course will therefore focus on watercolour and oils, on fabric designs and on a range of print forms - wood engravings, lino cuts, screen prints and more. We focus on Edward Bawden and Eric Ravilious, who, together, discovered the Essex village of Great Bardfield as a place to live and work (and not too far from opportunities to exhibit in London). We examine lesser known artists including John Aldridge, Chloe Cheese, Michael Rothenstein and Terza Ravilious. This was a vibrant, hard-working artistic community, and there will be many pleasures in looking at both artworks and artists' lives. **N.B.** Last meeting 8 February. This will be an online Zoom course.

# THE DAWN OF WESTERN CIVILISATION Gary Slator

This course will examine the archaeological and epigraphic evidence for the arrival of civilisation in Bronze Age Greece and trace the development of Mycenaean civilisation, along with the evidence for the Trojan War. We will go on to look at reasons for the collapse of Bronze Age Greece and its legacy for later Greek history, before analysing the nature of the so-called Dorian Conquest. **N.B.** Last meeting 21 March. This will be an online Zoom course.

Since UNESCO established the World Heritage Convention in 1972, 17 sites in England have qualified for their exceptional landscape or architecture. We will examine this World Heritage architecture, at places as varied as the Tower of London, Maritime Greenwich, Durham Castle and Blenheim Palace, and also the Palace of Westminster, now facing a major and controversial restoration.

This course offers a chance to explore the causes and consequences of the changes that characterised this fascinating period in Europe's history.

### **A LOVE SUPREME: THE HISTORY AND APPRECIATION OF JAZZ**

### Steve Kershaw

What is jazz? Where did it come from? How did it develop? How can we develop and increase our enjoyment and appreciation of this exhilarating, yet sometimes seemingly intimidating art form? Presented by one of the most highly respected jazz double bass players in the country, this course will look at the origins of jazz music, provide some strategies for listening to it, and survey the main styles of the genre in a way that is accessible both to those keen to 'get into' the music, and those who already enjoy listening to it. Illustrated with classic recordings, 'live' demonstrations and with an optional concert from a world-class band in the evening, this course could be the start of a lifelong love of jazz.

- 1. New Orleans and the Birth of Jazz a look at how diverse musical elements came together in New Orleans to create the music known as 'jazz'.
- 2. How to Listen to Jazz exploring different ways in which we can listen to, understand, and enjoy the way jazz music works.
- 3. Dixieland to Swing listening, analysis and appreciation of the development of the early styles of jazz.
- 4. Be-Bop and Beyond listening, analysis and appreciation of the development of some of the more modern forms of jazz up to the present day.

"Quite apart from being one of the country's best bass players, with a style both hugely propulsive and sensitively melodic when required, Steve has also become a musical catalyst, bringing together players and styles from all over the world" (Jazz Views). He graduated from the Musicians Institute in Hollywood, USA, as Outstanding Student of the Year in 1996. Since then, he has played in over 30 countries with an eclectic host of luminaries ranging from the mainstream talents of Jamie Cullum, through the contemporary excellence of Bobby Wellins, to the avant-garde extremes of Evan Parker.

Steve's publications include *A New Tune a Day: Bass Guitar*, and among his large catalogue of recordings his Anglo-Scandinavian trio Stekpanna's *All For a Beautiful Life* album was selected in the critics' top ten records of the year by Jazz Views Magazine. The eponymous Latin From the North shared the same accolade, as did his trio release *Under a Different Sky*, with Leonid and Nick Vintskevich.
