



# The Romantic Generation: Music in the Nineteenth Century

Through a wealth of varied musical illustrations, this course will chart the move from Classicism to the high Romantic drama of Liszt and Wagner, covering:

- Romanticism's gracious and well-bred beginnings,
- the passion and emotion of the Italians,
- the innovations of the French,
- the radicalism of nationalist composers, and
- the final flourishes of Romanticisn in the early twentieth century.

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# **Course Description**

This course will attempt to define the rather nebulous idea of 'Romanticism' as it is customarily applied to nineteenth-century music.

Using numerous illustrations drawn from all musical genres, it will consider the output of Romantic composers in the context of the prevailing cultural ideas of the period.

It will describe how Romanticism reinterpreted Classical conventions while at the same time expanding the language of music and placing greater emphasis on artistic individuality.

# By the end of the course students should be able to:

- appreciate the general concept of musical 'Romanticism'
- use their acquired knowledge in order to guess fairly accurately from which part of the nineteenth century any given Romantic work may date
- recognise some of the different strands of European Romanticism (e.g. the contrasting approaches of German and French composers)
- contrast the operatic achievements of Verdi and Wagner with the predominantly instrumental works from Russia, Bohemia and Scandinavia
- describe some of the social and musical upheavals that led to the demise of Romanticism
