It is women only at night but men are more than welcome during the day. The women do lots of campaigning while not in their camp. TRIDENT REPLACEMENT and AWE ALDERMASTON

AWE Aldermaston has been at the centre of the UK's nuclear weapons production since 1950. From 1958 onwards, under the Mutual Defence Agreement, the UK and the US agreed to exchange information on "atomic weapon design, development and fabrication capability". Since then all of the UK's nuclear weapons have been designed, tested and built (in collaboration with the US) at Aldermaston. The warheads for the current Trident system were built at Aldermaston, are refurbished at AWE Burghfield and transported along our roads between there and Faslane. Since 2002, the government has invested in building new facilities at AWE, and recruited new staff to test, design and build the next generation of nuclear warheads. Aldermaston Women's Peace Camp(aign) will give us much more information on this at our AGM on 6th March (see above). Please come along!



When Parliament voted in March 2007 to replace the current Trident system, they only agreed to new submarines and missiles. They did not vote to replace the warheads. Since this vote, which only just got through, the government has continued to claim that a decision has not yet been made to replace the current warhead system. However, continued building work at Aldermaston and other evidence suggests that this decision **has** already been made.

An "Initial Gate" decision to move forward with the actual manufacture and production of the submarines, etc has been delayed by the government until after the Nuclear Non Proliferation Treaty in May 2010. This decision has to be brought before Parliament, so we need to campaign very hard between now and then.
