ST BENOIT VISIT September 2023

We are now very much looking forward to our visit to Saint-Benoit during October half-term. A group of about twenty people from Cookham Twinning will be journeying to Saint-Benoit, staying with local families and participating in a weekend of cultural and social activities. Meanwhile the latest news-sheet from Saint-Benoit reports back from their 20th 'Flowers of May' festival, when the centre of Saint-Benoit is closed and becomes a flower market. The theme this year was climbing plants, and residents were able to have a free plant of their choice to embellish their garden. The Saint-Benoit environmental focus continues, with all 1,425 street lamps being changed to LED. There is a target in Poitiers, (of which Saint-Benoit is a part), to reduce energy consumption in 2025 by 43% in comparison with 2021. Saint-Benoit also has some cliffs alongside their river valley, and one of their ambitions is to re-establish safe climbing, working in collaboration with qualified climbing organisations. It is not expected that climbing the cliffs will be on the itinerary of our October visit!
