Most of Cookham to the east of the railway line, and in low-lying riverside parts west of it are subject to relatively frequent (fast flowing and/or deep) flooding from the River Thames. STREETS AT RISK OF RIVER FLOOD OR BEING CUT OFF

BEFORE A FLOOD

- Register: individuals, organisations and businesses in Cookham should register with the Environment Agency's Floodline Warnings Direct on 0845 988 1188
- Prepare a flood kit: containing key personal documents, torch, battery or wind-up radio, mobile phone, rubber gloves, Wellington boots, waterproof clothing, first aid kit and blankets.
- Individuals should make a flood plan: list essential things you need to take in a flood evacuation; make sure you know how to turn off gas and electricity, even in the dark; install protective equipment such as doorguards and closeable airbricks (sandbags may not be available); work out how to protect valuable and sentimental belongings; where would you move your car to?
- Businesses and organisations should make a flood plan: safe evacuation of customers and visitors; protection of property and business from flood damage.

DURING A FLOOD

In a severe flood, the roads north of Cookham Village to Bourne End and west across the Moor will be flooded first. The police will close these roads, and traffic will be diverted south along the A4094 Sutton Road until it floods. The causeway will be closed to vehicular traffic, except emergency vehicles, but open to pedestrians. Cookham Parish Council will appoint a Community Emergency Management Team and set up a Local Emergency Operations Centre in the Parish Office, High Rd (01628 522003). Its Community Flood Plan has prepared it to:

- take direction from and provide information to RBWM's Emergency Operation Centre
- collate information on vulnerable people and co-ordinate volunteer helpers
- liaise with local boat owners to deliver help to those in need
- provide local information to emergency responders from fire, police, ambulance, territorial army and RBWM
- liaise with upstream parishes at Hurley and Bisham
- open up survivor centres at Pinder Hall, Lower Road, SL6 9EH

AFTER A FLOOD

Local Emergency Operations Centre will co-ordinate survivor centres and support.

- BEWARE of danger from sewage overflow, electrical and gas problems when returning to your property
- make records and photograph damage
- call your insurer
- ask for help if you are struggling
