How it will happen: On 11th and 12th May.

Arrive at the Moor and have your canvas stamped on the back. This will be your entry to the competition and only a canvas with the official stamp will be included in the exhibition.

You will be given the location to paint. You may not choose. This is part of the fun! You will be sharing a location with other artists just to make the day more sociable.

During the weekend judges may visit you to see how you are getting along- Do not worry as it is all very informal. All artists of any ability are encouraged to join in. We want you to enjoy the experience!

You can start on 12th May if you can not do both days.

By the end of the Day (5pm) 12th May

Hand in your painting at the marquee on the moor. Frames are not required for entries on canvas. Water- colours or works on paper should be window mounted but not framed so think about getting a mount ready beforehand. Please note paintings MUST be dry enough to handle. If you choose to use oils think about using quick drying oil paint or acrylic. NB: Juniors work must be handed in by the end of the day on 12th May to allow time to choose the best ones and present them for the exhibition along side the adult entries. Not quite finished? There may be many reasons why your painting is not done not withstanding bad weather. So just in case you need a bit of finishing off, there is an option to bring to the Grove Heritage Centre on

Thursday 16th May strictly between 10 am and 11 am. Judging will begin at 11 am. Work will be hung in an exhibition during the day ready for the

Prize giving reception 6.30pm to 8pm.

All participating adults are invited to the reception to hear from our head judge Timmy Mallett who will present the prizes to artists whose paintings we consider best capture the spirit of Stanley Spencer. Junior prize winners will be notified earlier in the week and are invited to come along and receive their prizes from our judges.

Once this exhiition closes, a selection of paintings will be taken to Holy Trinity Parish Centre and may be exhibitied there for sale subject to commission for the rest of May if artists agree.
